In conjunction with the 8 p.m. screenings of the film (Oct. 18 at Acton's Trinity United Church and Oct. 19 at St. John's United

Church in Georgetown), special guest Ernie Regehr will lecture on the disarmament issue.
Mr. Regehr is a repre-

sentative of the peace movement "Project Ploughshares" and is with the Institute For Peace and Conflict Studies at Conrad Grebel College in Waterloo.
Clarke McDonald, the newly-appointed moderat-

or of the United Church of Canada, will also be talking about nuclear disarmament during a church service at Trinity United Oct. 3.

A Georgetown woman was involved in a one-car rollover on Highway 7 at Trafalgar Road Sunday. Sarah Langley, 30, of Chelvin Drive, driving a 1971 Cutlass, was eastbound on Highway 7 and veered into the south ditch, rolled over and came to rest on its roof against a fence. The driver was ejected from the car. She was taken to Georgetown District Hospital by ambulance suffering from head injuries. Charges are pending.

CVCA acquisitions

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority has been granted \$350,000 by the province's natural resources ministry to help it purchase 1,500 acres of valley lands in the Mississauga area. Property will be acquired as it becomes available on the open market, with highest priority given to the more flood-prone land. Total estimated cost of the long-range acquisition project is \$1 million.

Need any trees replanting?

The Halton Region Conservation Authority is taking applications for its Farm Tree Replacement Program, primarily designed to assist rural landowners with a minimum of acres in replacing the once plentiful elm trees lost through the Dutch elm disease with suitable alternatives.

With a minimum order of 25 and a maximum of 100 trees, the Authority will plant six to ten foot trees at a nominal cost. Applicants can choose from Sugar and Silver Maple, white and Mountain Ash and Carolina Poplar. Deadline for applications is Oct. 15.

All applications will be reviewed and an Authority staff member will inspect the site before planting.

The Authority is also accepting applications for the private lands reforestation assistance program, directed to the rural areas of the watershed.

The program is designed to do three things:

1. Reforest poor quality agricultural lands.
2. Develop windbreak

protection along fence rows and laneways.

3. Provide erosion control along stream banks and creek valleys.

Through nursery stock application forms obtained from either the mini-

stry of natural resources or the Halton Region Conservation Authority, seedlings may be purchased.

Hardwood and coniferous seedlings are available to fulfill the above objectives. The trees are

two and a half cents each and if planting assistance is required, the Conservation Authority will charge a nominal fee. The Authority will plant a minimum of 1,000 trees to a maximum of 20,000 trees per property per year. We ask that

property per year. We ask that enquiries about this program be made as soon as possible for planting in the spring of 1983. All applications will be reviewed by the Forestry Department.
