The summer is nearing the end and so is the Agricrew Program. The two Halton crews were kept busy doing various farm chores. The crews only missed a couple of days due to wet weather.

Duplicate bridge

Probably the closest thing to a dishonest card player is one who offers what is termed "unauthorized information".

In many cases, such a condition is easily detected and even better, you the player need not get involved. A simple summons of the director will reap all the rewards for you when any questionable occurrence exists.

Should it be that you are not sure or if you feel embarrassed about this kind of accusation, don't. The director is your protector. You simply need to demonstrate a concern regarding anything that you consider questionable, explain same to the director or immediately before the hand is completed and sit back and relax.

Should it turn out that your query be wrong, at least it was explained so that it became clear. If you are right, then you and your partner laugh all the way to the bank. No one has the right to unauthorized information and when

it happens, the ruling is always in favor of the non-guilty party.

The point is demonstrated by the play of today's hand when East claimed to have no spades during the auction. One cannot say "I have no spades" during an auction.

The director was summoned and awarded North-South the 5 diamond contract which they can make. Because of the passing of the unauthorized information, the director may adjust the score to a possible result...a clear top. This was the hand.

THE ANALYSIS:

N-S have an 8 card spade fit and 22 HCP between them, so it would seem that they'd play a spade partscore on this deal. They may, but most likely as defenders of IS!

After W opens 1S North has no convenient bid, and

If East also passes, South will see no reason to balance. It is an awkward hand both to play and defend. Even though it looks as if West should take only 2 tricks (the club K and the 5th spade) the defenders will probably allow declarer to take 4 because they can't draw trumps (declarer would run hearts).

If East scrapes up a 1NT response to 1S he'll be surprised to hear his partner's 2H rebid. He should jump to 4H because it might make and if it doesn't N-S have a minor game. In fact 4H goes off one but N-S can make 3D.
