



# Murder gets top priority

The investigation into last weekend's murder of a Georgetown man is top priority for the Peel regional police homicide department.

Inspector James Wingate said 20 officers have

Anthony Babakos, 32, was shot twice in the chest while working in the kitchen of his Brampton restaurant and tavern.

He was remembered by family and friends Monto Greece for burial.

Police said a man armed with a handgun came into the Vega Steakhouse and Tavern at the Southgate Mall in Bramalea Saturday afternoon and after asking for Mr. Babakos, fired two shots then fled on

Mr. Babakos bought into the steakhouse only last year, after working as cook for three years at the Royal Pizzeria and Spaghetti House in George-

Police aren't revealing

Production began here yesterday (Thursday) morning on the \$2.3 million film biography of Terry Fox with at least two crew members scrambling to make final arrangements.

While Halton regional police directed through traffic around a movie crew on River Drive above the paper mill dam, location manager Otta Hanus was searching for a sixth Halton Hills location to be used Monday and casting director Karen Pike was hoping for a few mere extras.

As of presstime yesterday, about a dozen residents had taken up the challenge and signed on as extras for the major motion picture being produced by Robert Cooper for Home Box Office and the CTV network. Ms. Pike said she was hoping to recruit a large number of people, especially teenagers, for today's sequences along Highway 7 in Georgetown and at the Deirex marketplace. Dozens of extras will be signed up today starting at

9 a.m. See Ms. Pike at the marketplace.

Mr. Hanus, meanwhile, had selected the stretch of River Drive outside Union Presbyterian Church above Glen Williams for Monday's filming. It became necessary at the last minute as a replacement for a stretch of highway outside Milton's Kelso Conservation Area, which Mr. Hamus discovered to his horror this week has been resurfaced with gravel. During his 1980 Marathon of Hope, Terry Fox had to avoid all gravel stretches; paved surfaces were essential.

The switch wasn't quite as disturbing a development as one that threatened to slow production on another movie he'd worked on, Mr. Hanus joked.
