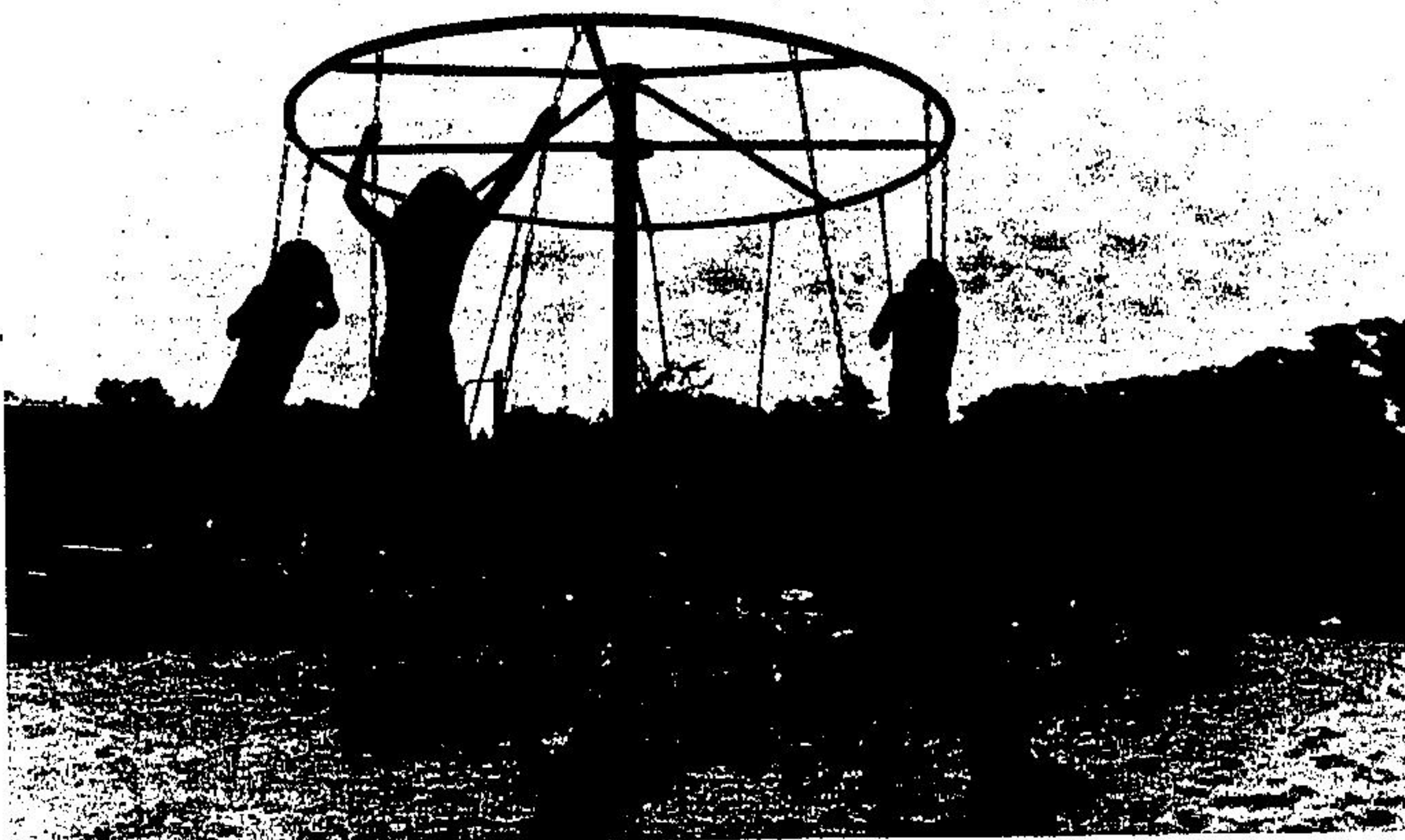

# Murder gets top priority

The investigation into last weekend's murder of a Georgetown man is top priority for the Peel regional police homicide department.

Inspector James Wingate said 20 officers have been assigned to work on

the case full time.

Anthony Babakos, 32, was shot twice in the chest while working in the kitchen of his Brampton restaurant and tavern.

He was remembered by family and friends Monday and his body was sent

to Greece for burial.

Police said a man armed with a handgun came into the Vega Steakhouse and Tavern at the Southgate Mall in Bramalea Saturday afternoon and after asking for Mr. Babakos, fired two shots then fled on

foot.

Mr. Babakos bought into the steakhouse only last year, after working as cook for three years at the Royal Pizzeria and Spaghetti House in Georgetown.

Police aren't revealing

any information about the case, and are investigating whether there is a link between the murder and a robbery at the restaurant ten days prior.

## Council lays down rules for 4th line gravel work

A company working on reconstruction of the Fourth Line was granted a permit to extract 11,000 tonnes of gravel from a local wayside pit by town

council Wednesday.

Bot Construction of Oakville will be allowed to carry out extraction on a two acre strip on Lot 25, Concession 5 (one mile

east of Acton) beginning Oct. 30.

Several considerations had to be outlined before the application was accepted.

Pit operations are to be prohibited from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive and all day Sunday.

Rehabilitation details were approved, with the understanding that if no extension to the gravel extraction is granted, the schedule for grading and replacing top soil must be completed within two years of the application permit.

There is a warrant out for the arrest of Richard Holmes, 22, of Acton, following his failure to appear in Milton provincial court Monday. He was charged with causing a disturbance and assaulting police July 25, following a disturbance outside a Mill Street restaurant. Kevin Slater, 20, charged with obstructing police in the same disturbance appeared in court Monday and will be tried Dec. 9.

## Armstrong joins AMO

Coun. Mike Armstrong has been elected to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) as a director.

The regional councillor for Ward 4 was notified at the association's two-day convention, which ended Tuesday.

The ten-year veteran of municipal politics was nominated by council to the post. Coun. Armstrong's duties will include making recommendations to the province concerning regional government.

"I'd like to get on the committee that will be making those recommendations because as you know, I have very strong feelings about the region," Coun. Armstrong said.
