Former Glen Williams resident Williamina Crawford died Aug. 16 at Toronto's Wellesley General Hospital following a lengthy bout with cancer. She was 58.

Born in Dundee, Scotland, she moved to Glen Williams after she was married and lived there

for 15 years. She is survived by her husband, John, sons William, Murray and David and daughters Margaret (Mrs. Wally Smith of Orangeville) and Lynn (Mrs. George Bailey of Fergus). Mrs. Crawford is also survived by a sister, Mrs. D. Cox of Welland, and

was the loving daughter-in-law of Maggie Crawford of Georgetown.

She was buried at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Orangeville. (Most recently, Mrs. Crawford was an Orangeville resident). Services were held at the Dods and McNair Funeral Home in Orangeville and conducted by Rev. Graham Bland of St. Alban's Anglican Church in Glen Williams.

Mrs. Crawford served with the ATS (British Army) during World War II and was a member of the Royal Canadian Legi-

on, Branch 449 in Alton.

Arcade won't relocate

Out of business for a number of months, Acton Arcade owner Dennis Devine has decided not to relocate his games room in another part of Acton.

He and his partner, Mark Edwards, initially opened their arcade in an abandoned gas station on Acton's outskirts, but the Ontario Municipal Board later ruled that the gas station's zoning did not permit the arcade.

The town's licensing by-laws prohibit arcades from locating within 300 meters of a house or school

and while the town was considering amending its bylaw to enable the arcade to locate in Acton's urban area, Mr. Devine announced last week that it is currently impossible for his business to fund a move or fight any opposition to a relocation proposal.

In a recent letter, Acton's Business Improvement Area board of management told council it felt the licensing bylaw should remain intact, opposing any arcades in the downtown core.
