Cancer claims Betty Walker in midst of election planning

Well respected by her colleagues as a community-minded hard worker, Halton Hills' Ward 2 school trustee Betty Walker died Sunday afternoon after a sudden recurrence of cancer that was first detected ten months ago.

The RRU Norval resident, a widow and mother of three, had taken a leave of absence from Halton board of education duties last winter to undergo cancer treatment in California and

Arizona and returned optimistic that it had been checked.

She entered Peel Memorial Hospital a month ago suffering from back pain but discovered to her relief that it was caused by a slipped vertebra disc. Resting in hospital, she began planning her re-election campaign, hoping to be recovered in time for some canvassing, but suddenly the cancer reappeared and progressed rapidly. Mrs. Walker was

acclaimed to her first term in 1980, filling the newly-created Ward 2 seat after fellow trustee Betty Fisher switched wards to represent Georgetown on the school board. The two became immediate friends during Mrs. Fisher's 1978 campaign and, together with Ward 1 trustee Arlene Bruce, forged a strong sense of solidarity to represent Halton Hills at the Burlington board meetings. Sharing the family's

shock and grief, Mrs. Fisher said Sunday night that Mrs. Walker had remained optimistic about beating cancer from the time it was first diagnosed last November until a very short time before her death.

"She'd been at the absolute peak of health (since returning from cancer treatment clinics in the southwest)," Mrs. Fisher said. "She was a real trooper; a real fighter. And she always
