Series B is aimed at children from Grade 4 to 8 and consists of two productions. The cost is only \$4. Time and place are the same as for Series A.

The first Oct. 31 stars magician Ron Oliver and is aptly titled "You Will Believe in Magic." March 6, Series B ends with "A Taste of Canada" featuring folksinger Wiz Bryant.

CRTC slows cable hike

The Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) ruled Sept. 1 that Halton-Triangle Investments Limited, which serves cable TV subscribers in Georgetown, Acton, Milton and the surrounding area, must follow the federal government's six and five per cent increase guidelines.

The CRTC said the company may only raise its monthly rates this year from \$8 to \$8.48 and next July, to \$8.80. The company was seeking permission to hike the rate to \$10.

Cable T.V. Rate Increase

Halton Cable Systems announces that, commencing September 1st, 1982, there will be a minor increase in Cable Television rates for subscribers in the area served by the company.

Primary outlets only are affected, and are subject to an increase of 48¢ per month, plus Ontario Sales Tax, in the amount of 0.3¢ per month.

New rates, as approved by the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission are as follows:

- 1 outlet \$8.48 plus 59¢ OST (Total \$9.07)
- 2 outlets \$10.48 plus 73¢ OST (Total \$11.21)
- 3 outlets \$12.48 plus 87¢ OST (Total \$13.35)
- 4 outlets \$14.48 plus \$1.01 OST (Total \$15.49)
