The Canadian Radiotelevision and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) ruled Sept. 1 that Halton-Triangle Investments Limited, which serves cable TV subscribers in Georgetown, Acton, Milton and the surrounding area, must follow the federal government's six and five per cent increase guidellnes.

The CRTC said the company may only raise its monthly rates this year from \$8 to \$8.48 and next July, to \$8.80. The company was seeking permission to hike the rate to \$10.




