Home care set to begin

Recommended a year ago by the Halton District Health Council, a home care program for the region's chronically ill begins Sept. 15. Some 650 residents will receive nursing, occupational, speech and physiotherapy and homemaking services from the regional health unit. The Ontario ministry of health approved the program, but has yet to approve Health Council requests for chronic care beds for Halton Hills, Oakville and Burlington. With the go-ahead given last June for 47 nursing home beds at Georgetown hospital, a new wing is scheduled for opening by the end of 1983.

Teacher's Day

Teachers can discover Ontario's rural heritage at the Ontario Agricultural Museum at Milton on Teachers' Day, Sept. 11 and 12, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The days will offer teachers an opportunity to observe and participate in the Museum's educational programmes. Students are able to gain an understanding of the development of agriculture and rural life in the province, from the pioneer period to the present day. The museum has more than 20 buildings, including display barns, a crossroads community, two historic farmsteads, church, weaver's cottage and much more. It's an excellent experience for students to appreciate how we have evolved socially, agriculturally and industrially to the 1980s. Teachers will be admitted free of charge and are welcome to tour the 80-acre site on their own. Guided tours which focus on the school programmes will be conducted throughout the day.

Our Susan helping out researchers

McMaster University medicine student Susan Brunt of Georgetown is one of 17 university and high school scholarship students currently assisting research at McMaster's Faculty of Health Sciences thanks to a series of grants totalling \$61,936. According to the Hamilton university's public relations office, all of the students selected to work with researchers for up to 12 weeks have excellent records in biological sciences and aspire to careers in the health professions. Each has been assigned to a specific research project designed to find the answers to complex biological questions. Ms. Brunt is working with Dr. J. Denburg investigating chronic myeloid leukemia, measuring blood levels of histamine which rise

prior to the appearance of acute episodes of the disease. The students applied in late 1981 to the Ontario Heart Foundation of McMaster. A selection committee awarded the scholarships based on individual abilities. Ms. Brunt's project was sponsored through a \$3,400 grant from the Crusade Against Leukemia. Employment and Immigration Canada was the biggest donor to the program, granting \$27,506 to a number of projects.
