

Draft plan grapples with gravel issue

Readying our official plan

The town's general committee completed its overview of 60 submissions from government agencies, private businesses and individuals on the draft Halton Hills official plan Monday night.

The lengthy process of gathering submissions and responding to queries on the new plan fell to planning consultants Walker, Wright, Young Associates of Toronto, the firm that's been working with the planning department and official plan task force since January to complete the project. The submissions were unveiled Thursday night at a special general committee meeting.

Policies in the plan are designed to guide development in town for the next 20 years. It contains numerous new concepts developed under the province's Planning Act, and amalgamates policies already established in the official plans of Esquewaug, Georgetown and Acton which are now in force. Council is expected to

begin a submission-by-submission review of changes recommended by the consulting firm next week and officials are hoping the document will be endorsed and delivered to the province's ministry of housing and municipal affairs in about three weeks.

Without the Credit Valley Conservation Authority holding a public meeting to discuss its hazard land mapping policies, which have caused some confusion in the official plan. Hazard lands, usually found near waterways but not to be confused with floodplains, restrict development.

One of the largest submissions from a private agency came from the Aggregate Producers Association of Ontario, which argued that part of the plan restrict the development of the aggregate industry in town.

REGION PLAN
The lengthy submission was described Thursday night by planning consultant Peter Walker as "positioning for a fight", but he reminded councillors that the town is following policies established under the region's official plan, a document the town must by law follow. The battle over planning policies concerning mineral resources will be waged between the aggregate producers and the region, he said, with the town playing only a minor role.



Arson suspected in two car fires

Firefighters and Halton regional police were called to a Mountainview Road South parking lot Thursday night about 10:45 p.m. in response to two car fires. Arson is suspected in the fires that burned out a 1975 Austin Marina and a 1972 Ford Maverick. There was \$2,500 damage to the two cars and police are investigating the incident.
