The Scouts, Cubs and Beavers registration night is next Monday (Sept. 20) at 7:30 at the community centre.

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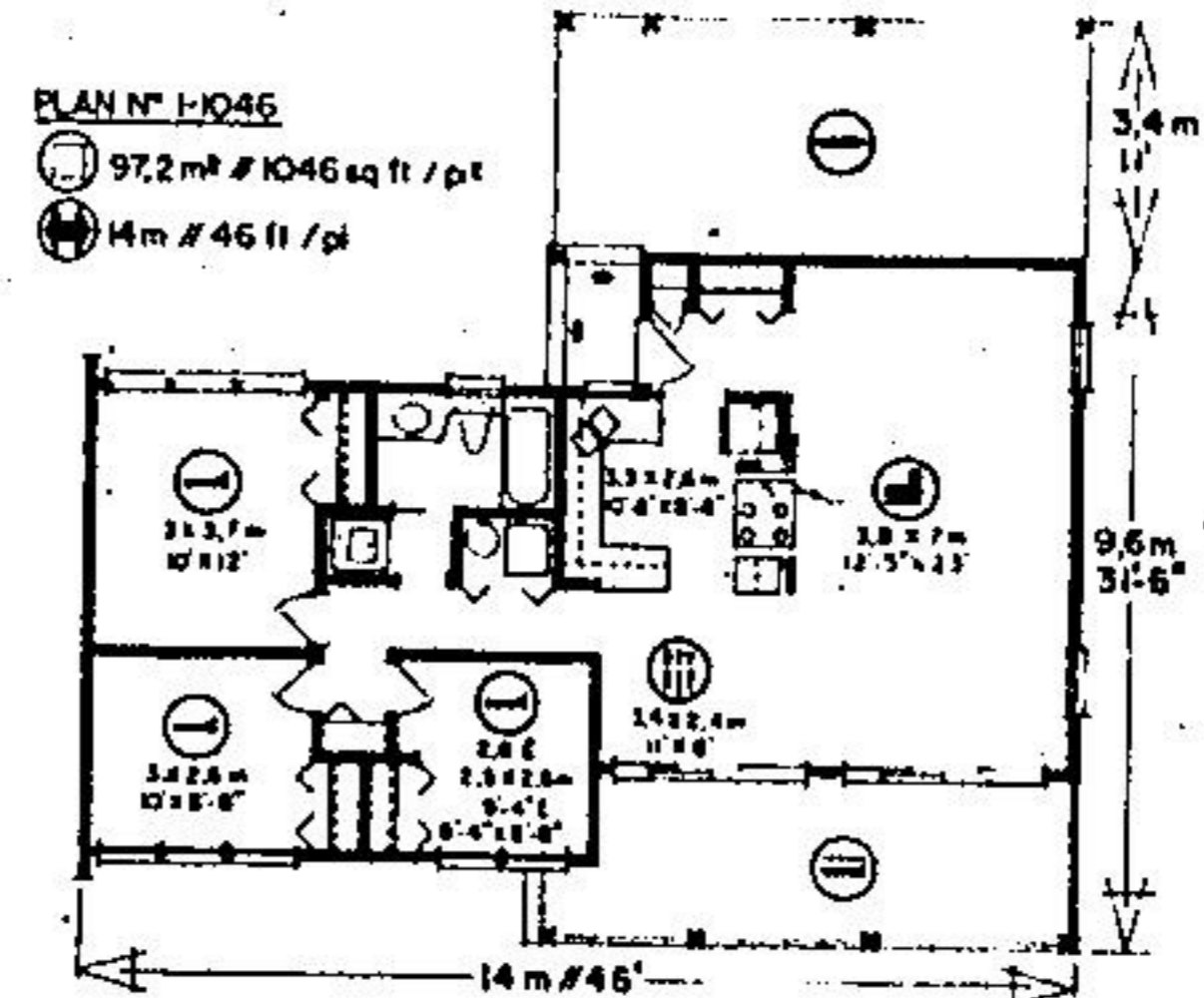
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
