Bill Roney headed a committee to approach every ex-serviceman in town about joining. Rent for the rooms was raised to \$2.50 per night (heat included)! The Poppy Committee of those days was elected for two year terms and saw a good section of the branch acting on this important committee.  
Zone Commander Dr. Adams attended the annual meeting held in March, 1934, and installed the

following officers: G.O. Brown, president, C.V. Williams and C.J. Cummings as vice presidents, Bert Parr, Sec'y; Wallace Thompson as treasurer and an executive of Com. Cousins, Learmonth, Kenny and W. Brennan, Sgt. at Arms H. Sheppard. Gordon Brown headed the Legion for four years, probably the most crucial in the history of the Legion, embracing as it did, twice moving to new quarters, and the advent of beer in Ontario and the subsequent application for a licence to sell beer in the club room. On April 26, 1934, arrangements were

made to move to quarters to what was then known as the King Block. The turning point in the financial condition, heretofore on a precarious basis took a momentous turn when at a special executive meeting it was moved to apply for a licence to sell beer to members.  
G. Cousins was chairman to draft rules and regulations and Henry Sheppard appointed caterer. J.D. Kelly, Dr. Learmonth and G. Cousins were appointed to supervise operation of the beverage room.
