Appreciation is expressed to the many coaches, managers and referees who helped to make it a successful season. Recognition is also given to the Recreation Department for the special attention given to the game fields.

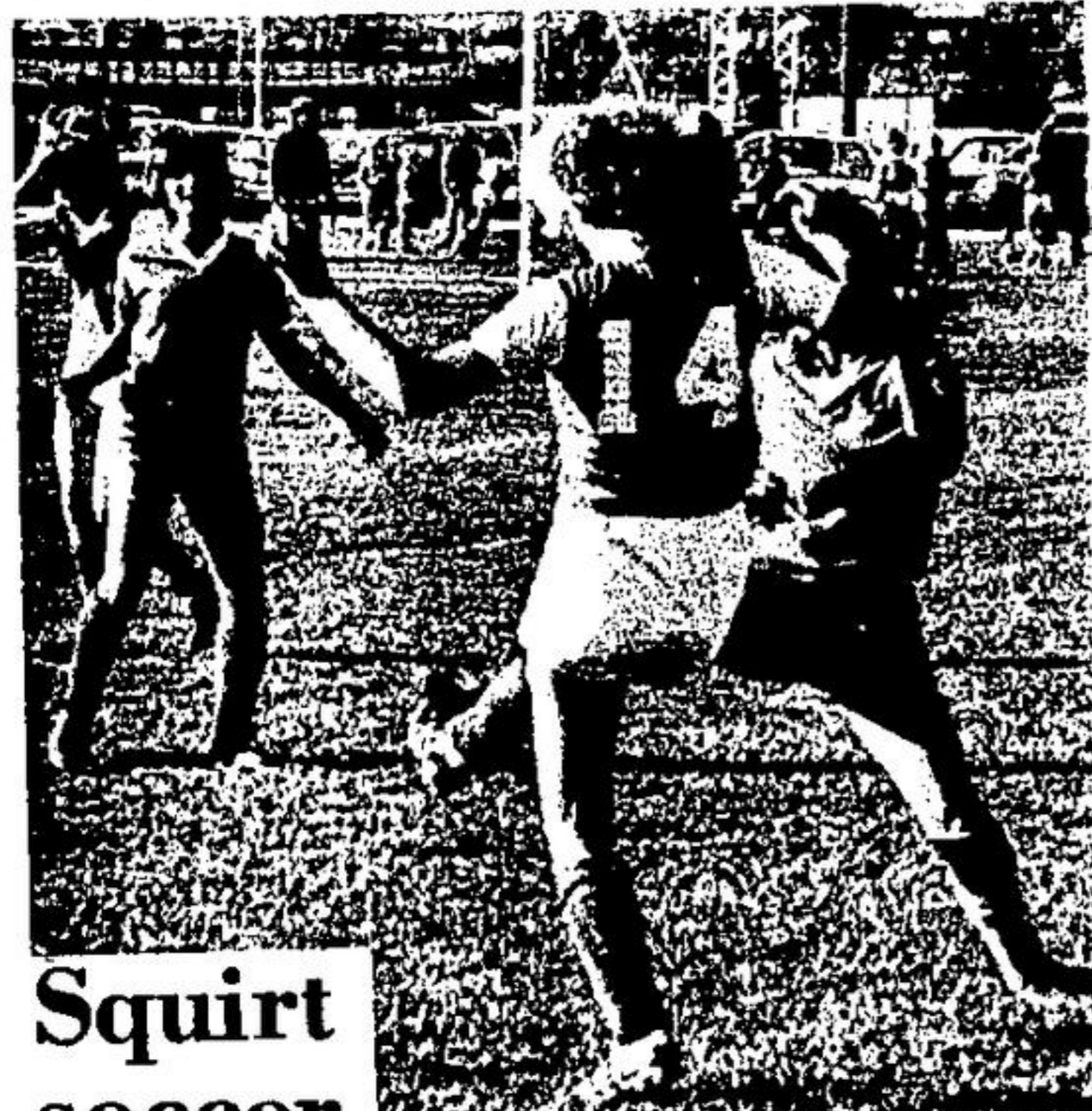
Girls final day
