Duck, goose hunt in Orangeville

The Orangeville Reservoir Conservation Area will be the site of a controlled duck and goose hunt from Sept. 25 to Oct. 30. This coincides with the opening of duck hunting season Sept. 25.

The supervision and control for the hunt will be provided by the Dufferin and Northern Peel Anglers and Hunters Association.

The number of hunters allowed into the Orangeville Reservoir will be limited.

Entrance into the area will be on a first come first serve basis. There is a \$3.50 entrance fee per vehicle. The days and hours of operation are Tuesdays and Thursdays, 4 p.m. to a half hour after sunset and Saturday mornings.

Hunting blinds will be provided on a first come first serve basis. Every hunter must have a dog or boat.

The hunt at the Orangeville Reservoir is the co-operative effort of the Dufferin and Northern Peel Anglers and Hunters Association, the Huronia District of the ministry of natural resources and the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

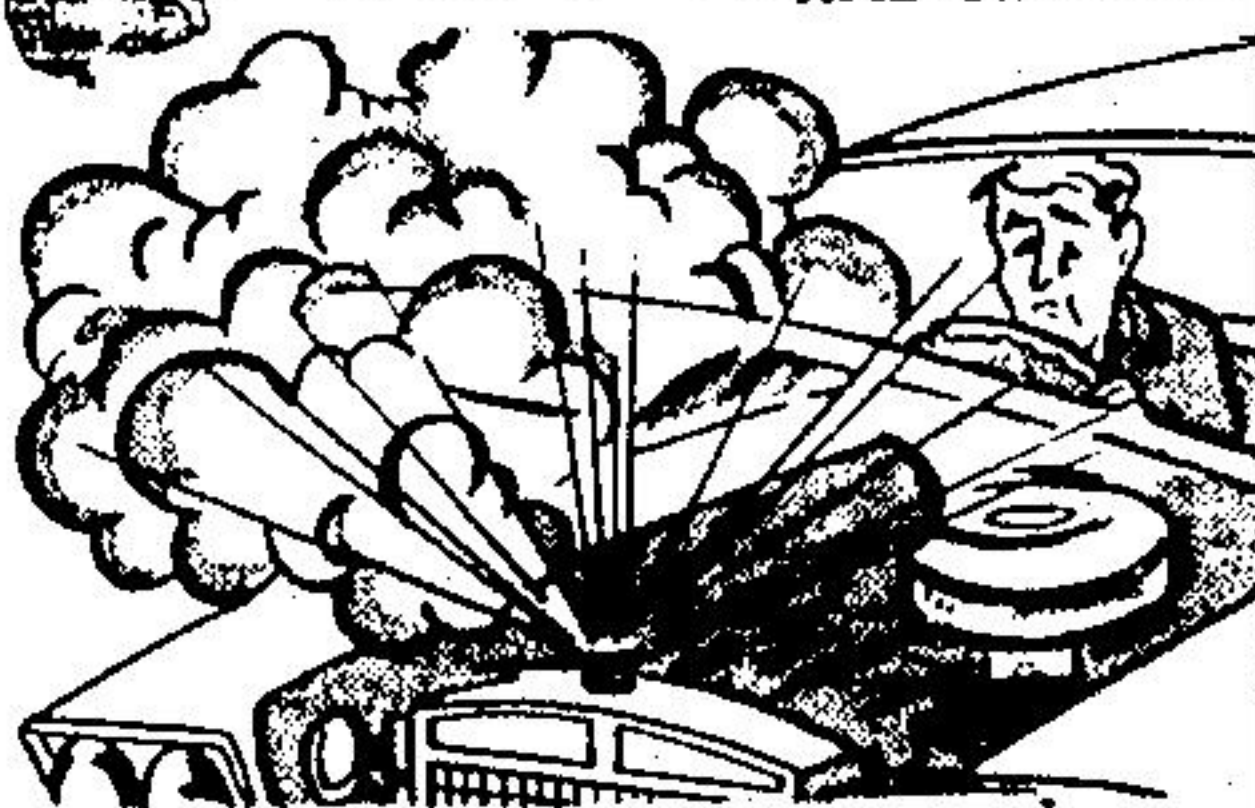
