**Downtown facelift**

Over the next six weeks, there'll be a dramatic change in downtown Georgetown as contractors begin the first phase of a facelift to improve sidewalks and roads and add decorative lighting. G.W. Barr Construction and Contracting Ltd. of Bolton has been chosen to do the \$125,973 job. Within Barr's bid is \$910 worth of work to add depressed curbs to area sidewalks to help residents in wheelchairs get around more easily.

**Condensed Bible won't encourage readers**

Well, it's out: the Reader's Digest Bible, the controversially condensed version of the Holy Scriptures.

This version or condensation took three and half years to prepare, but in my estimation they should have saved their time.

It's been said that "most church leaders and scholars will greet it with serious praise"; garbage. Any Bible that is cut by 40 per cent cannot be worth the paper it's printed on. If a person is going to read the Bible, then a cut will not encourage him any. Nor will it encourage others to read except out of curiosity, and then much will be missed.

The Bible is the Bible, and the injunction in Revelation 22:18-19 should be obeyed. Get your Bible out and read it, that is unless you have one of the new Reader's Digest condensed "books"; they have dropped it calling the verses an "ancient copyright" to protect the ideas of the writer.

Personally I will never read Reader's Digest again. This is the only way I can show my disapproval of the corporation and their flagrant disobeying of scripture.

A 40 per cent cut is more than just a "tightening up" of its format. I don't care that such well-known people as Oral Roberts, Pat Boone, Norman Vincent Peale and others think it makes the Bible more inviting to many

people. If any minister of the Gospel used this book in a service I was attending, I personally would leave that service.

The National Council of Churches receives four and a half per cent royalties on the price of \$16.95 (U.S.), because the council owns the copyright on the Revised Standard Version, the version used for the condensation.

**Board of education trustees resist urge to increase salaries**

Unlike fellow trustees who are voting themselves pay increases all across the province since the passing of provincial legislation allowing them to set

their own salaries, Halton board of education trustees are resisting the urge for a bigger share of the pie. A motion was presented at Thursday's meeting

that trustee honoraria for 1982-85 remain at \$7,200 a year and that the chairman be paid an additional 50 per cent of the yearly rate. Brought before the

board by trustees Noel Cooper, Len Crosier, Anne Fairfield, Len Auger, Cliff Schemmer and Betty Fisher, the motion will be voted on at the next board meeting.
