

COUNCIL NOTES

Trailbike concerns

Prompted by action taken recently by Etobicoke council, Halton Hills councillors are pressing the provincial government to introduce legislation controlling the use of trailbikes in open space and ravine areas. Coun. Russ Miller drafted a resolution similar to Etobicoke's seeking laws which would force trailbike riders to register their bikes and become licensed drivers. Coun. Miller said trailbikes have become a "big problem" for many people. Coun. Harry Levy maintained that many people are "not qualified to handle (the bikes)".

Feds to pay up?

Should the courts eventually find the federal government responsible for the problems homeowners now face with urea formaldehyde foam insulation (UFFI), municipalities should be able to claim loss of assessment damages as homes with the insulation are devalued. This argument, presented by Etobicoke council, was endorsed by Halton Hills council Monday night. Council agreed that the province should act on the municipalities' behalf in any attempt to collect lost revenue from the federal government.

Access opposed

Brampton city council is opposed to an entranceway being built on Winston Churchill Boulevard leading to the Croatian Centre south of Norval. Noting that Sideroad Five in Halton Hills already offers an alternative access route to the 160-acre property, Brampton councillors pointed out that their official plan controls the number of access points along major traffic arteries like Churchill. Last month, Halton Hills council argued that construction of access ways should be forbidden until the centre has submitted a comprehensive plan of development on the property, a document sought by council earlier this year.

Firefighters applauded

Having raised over \$13,000, the special committee organized from among the town's volunteer fire fighters to purchase rescue equipment was officially honored by council Monday night. Council agreed to send a letter of appreciation to the firefighters' association thanking the committee for efforts which have, over the last two years, given the town a "Jaws of Life" rescue tool and money for attachments and other rescue equipment. Funding for the rescue tool program has been a pet project of the Georgetown Lionesses as well.
