

The General Committee of Council Intends to consider the following amendment to By-law No. 81-141, the Licensing By-law, as it relates to the regulating of Auctioneers within the Town of Halton Hills on Sundays and certain holidays.

The proposed amendment is as follows: "Section 4(8):

Auctions are not permitted on any such days that are set aside or proclaimed for the purpose of celebrating or observing New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Christmas Day. An auction is permitted to be carried out on any other holiday. Auctions are permitted on Sunday at any location within the Town of Halton Hills, provided:

- (1) that the provisions of the Retail Business Holidays Act, Revised Statutues of Ontario, 1980, are compiled with.
- the auction shall be conducted after the hour of 12:01 o'clock in the forenoon.
- (3) the auction is conducted at one municipal address and does not occur more frequently than four times in any calendar year.
- (4) if the auction is conducted within a permanent structure, the provisions of Subsection (3) to Section 4(8) will not apply."
