Area schools dominate at meet

In the Bantam Girls Nancy Cocks was fourth, followed by Anna Toone in tenth position. Sonia Latissic was 14th while Kim Roy was 16th.

Glen Mulder was second in the Junior Boys division followed by Steve Eastwood in third, Cameron Herman was tenth and Andrew Hoddinott was 15th.

Mark Rosell was 20th in the race and his placing broke the tie with Stewarttown for the division title.

In the Junior Girls Tara Burroughs was first followed by Trina Wasylenko in fifth. Holly Hewitt was eighth and Kara Lynn Palmer was 13th.

The Intermediate Boys were first in their division. Jeff Amato was first, Brent Brasz second, Scott Lunn third and Dave Fisher fifth.

The Intermediate Girls were also first, led by Alison Irvine, Jenny Melville third, Samantha Windsor fourth and Tina Windsor fifth.

In the Senior Boys Joe

Wilkins was fourth, Janne Latornic 11th, Glen Hopkins 12th and Robin Cocks 14th.

The Senior Girls came

first after eleventh place finisher Jennifer Snyder broke the tie-breaker against Stewarttown.

Tammy Morrow was fourth, followed by Angie Bray. Kim Hale was eighth while Michelle McEachern was ninth.

The senior girls were the next to run. They finished second to Centennial. Running were Traci McFarlane second, Tammy Green third, Carolyn Grasby 10th, Vicki Laval-

lee 13th, and Susan Saxe 27 and the fifth runner decided the tiebreaker.

The senior boys team finished in second place. This was the only race Centennial did not finish in top spot. W.I. Dick came first. Stewarttown tied, but W.I. Dick won on the tiebreaker.

Running were Terry Dixon fifth, Jimmy Manning sixth, Mark Lamb ninth, David Tate 10th, and Jimmy Bick 13th.

These two seconds produced more points than any other team. They finished first overall in the senior divisions.
