Delrex Boulevard, Georgetown, resident Tom Simmon believes that advances are made in education, Halton parents, teachers and students must not lose track of the Catholic philosophy behind the separate school system.

Mr. Simmons, vice-president and general manager of HGL Leasing Inc. of Burlington, announced Thursday night he will run for the town's separate school board seat against incumbent Irene McCaulley and candidate Irene Wood.

"In today's secular

world, it becomes more and more difficult to equip our children with the skill and knowledge required for our complex society," he said in a prepared statement.

"The separate school system must also teach our children the required curriculum from a Catholic perspective and both parents and teachers must not lose sight of this objective."

Married with two children, Mr. Simmons moved to Georgetown in 1969. In the 1976 election, he campaigned against Hartley Sherk for the separate school board seat, but joined Vince Whelan's 1980 campaign.

Mr. Simmons told The Herald that "a quality Catholic educational system must be strongly supported by principals, teachers and parents", adding that those goals can only be achieved through "constructive communication".

His business background, he said, "will be an asset in obtaining for our children a high calibre of education at a cost we can afford".

As secretary-treasurer of the Halton Hills Columbus Club, he is actively involved in running the weekly Holy Cross Church bingo, funds from which provide support for parish, school and community projects.
