Hydro service in his resume

Georgetown's Ward 3 has a third candidate for its Halton Hills Hydro Commission seat. Downtown businessman Ralph Fletcher, who worked for hydro utilities for eleven years, will challenge incumbent Bill Smith and newcomer Norm Tretter. Fletcher's Family Shoes, established in early 1976 by Mr. Fletcher and his father Geoff, was a successful venture from the start that recently

In his eleven years' service with hydro utilities - the last seven in Brampton - Mr. Fletcher said he became proficient in overhead, underground and substation areas of power distribution in apprentice, journeyman and supervisory positions. He also spent four years obtaining hydro-related credits at college and university evening courses.

"With the amalgamation of Georgetown and Acton hydro and the projected future population growth, there'll be many important decisions to be made," he commented. "I know my practical and business experience will enable me to skillfully represent the hydro consumer."

Mr. Fletcher is married with three children.

Basic tools lost to salaries
