

Don Baker tells his graduates 'it's time to examine our concept of success'

'Never known a finer group,' - principal

The truest test of success in an organization is the quality of the product, Georgetown District High School principal Don Baker noted Saturday.

"And I've never been associated with a finer group of young people," he declared to about 500 proud parents attending the school's commencement. "You're a credit to this community."
