Centennial Public School of Georgetown dominated the pennant standings at the completion of the Halton cross country finals last Wednesday at Bronte Creek Park.

Under rain-swept conditions, Centennial runners captured five out of a possible eight division pennants.

Their nearest rivals were Stewarttown Public School, E.J. James Public School and New Central Public School who each won a pennant for their mantles.

In the Bantam Girls race George Kennedy Public School finished sixth with 115 points, with Centennial gaining fourth spot for a 98-point finish.

Centennial was tops in the Bantam Boys race with 42 points while Harrison Public School had 72 points. Joseph Gibbons had 133 points in

the race for fifth spot.

In the overall Bantam Division, Centennial finished in first with 148 points followed by George Kennedy with 22 and Harrison with 234 for third spot.

For the Junior Girls Division Centennial was third with 85 points while Stewarttown was fourth with 102 points. Leading in the Junior Boys section was Centennial with 55 points while Stewarttown was second with 78 points.

Overall in the Junior Division Centennial was third while Stewarttown was fourth.

In the Intermediate Girls Division Centennial was first with 22 points, followed by Stewarttown with 42 points. Centennial also captured a pennant for their Intermediate Boys section with a 26 point finish. Stewarttown was third with 47 points.

The overall point standings for Intermediates was Centennial with 48 in first with Stewarttown second with 89 points.

In the Senior Girls category, Stewarttown finished first with 29 points while Centennial followed in second with 50 points.

Centennial captured the Senior Boys crown with a 33-point finish. Stewarttown came in third with 51 points. The overall Senior total points favored Centennial as they edged Stewarttown 88-80.

Boxed in between two opposing runners is Stewarttown's Janelle Lewis, running in the Intermediate Girls division at Bronte Creek last Wednesday afternoon for the Halton championships. Janelle completed the course in 16th spot while her team was second to Centennial in the race.
