The Major Midget Sunny Acres team split a pair of games over the weekend with Burlington and Milton.

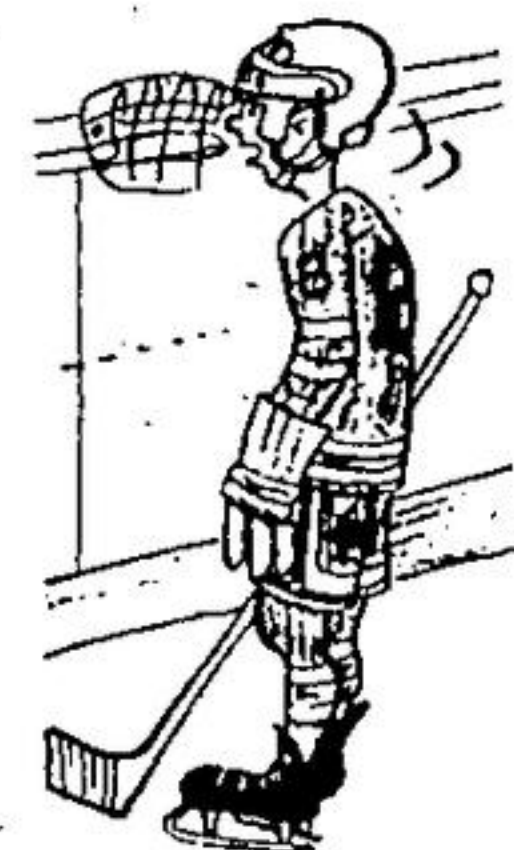

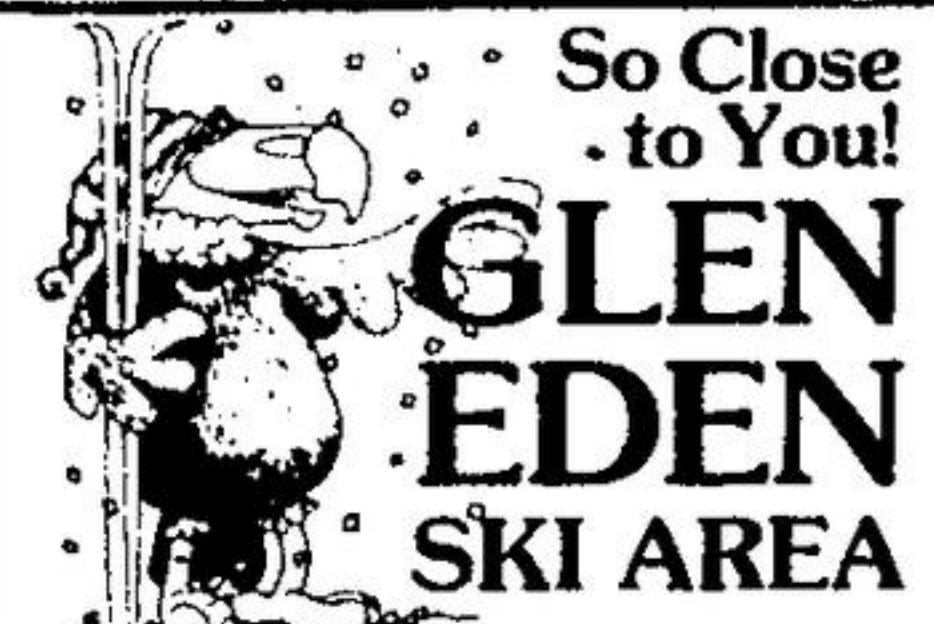
