to the talented puppeteers he was working with. This job with the CBC, however, has put The Mime Associates Company's touring and development on hold for a while.

Organized two years ago, after Mr. Mills graduated from the Toronto Mime School Unlimited, the company has done school tours of their commedia dell'arte show "Off the Wall", and has often performed at The

Tigers Coconut Grove, a reggae spot in Toronto's Kensington Market.

Mr. Mills said the company was formed with fellow prime students who decided they didn't want to rely on other companies to supply them with work.

Since taking theatre arts courses at the Georgetown District High School, Mr. Mills has been doing mime, but it wasn't until he finished high school and enrolled in film courses at Ryerson Polytechnical Institute

that he realized he would like to make a career of it.

TAKE-OFF

Trying to create as many of their own productions as possible, Mr. Mills said the company performs a take-off of the old Humphrey Bogart film "Casablanca", which they call "Cat'sablanca". Full of bad mouse jokes, the one-hour show features half-masked characters that look like a cat, dog, mice and rats. It stars "Humphrey Bogart" and "Ingrat Bergman".

To consider doing mime you have to be interested in using your body in the acting sense, Mr. Mills said. It requires stage presence and ability to perform in front of an audience, he said. He called mime a not very profitable field, especially in Canada.

Mr. Mills has been trained in the Lecoq style of mime. Jacques Lecoq is a Parisian mime who directed mimists to include acting in their performances beyond the pantomimes of Marcel Marceau.
