'Jungle Lore' for cub leaders

Knox Presbyterian Church Hall was the scene of a very enthusiastic group of Cub leaders who participated in a "Jungle Lore" workshop Saturday. Co-ordinator Terry Colter, assisted by trainers Elaine Hannah, Evelyn Owen and Walt Peters, prepared an outstanding program on jungle lore for each participant to return to their Cub packs with something with which to achieve new horizons.



Area Cubs can look forward to some adventures in the rainforests of India this season following a day-long Cub leader's workshop on Jungle Lore Saturday. A number of leaders gathered at Knox Presbyterian Church in Georgetown to learn how "lair" curtains, jungle names, totems, and special craft ideas related to the jungle and its denizens can turn weekly Cub meetings into thrilling and educational adventures. Mrs. Colter outlined the importance of using jungle lore in pack meetings by having the atmosphere, using lair curtains, jungle names, totems, a moon and during inspection using jungle terminology.

Other names can be adapted to suit the occasion.

Evelyn Owen read the Law of the Jungle. Discipline comes from the Law, which is basically all common sense.

Mrs. Hannah led in an action song and was in charge of crafts which included the elephant

woggle, marshmallow elephant and baker's dough craft, whereby each participant could make a jungle animal of his choice. Mrs. Hannah was also in charge of lunch and coffee breaks.

Walt Peters taught the various Jungle Dances which included the Dance

of Baloo and the Dance of Kaa. Mrs. Colter and Mr. Peters instructed a jungle opening and closing using the moon and jungle atmosphere.

Mrs. Colter pointed out that all boys enjoy stories, so let them be comfortable in a relaxed position in the circle. Another way to introduce the jungle char-

acters to the pack is by films, available at the library.

Jungle games were introduced by story then led by Mrs. Colter, making it easy for the leaders to put to use in their respective groups. Some of the games included Red Flower, Shere Khan and the Wolves, White Hood the Cobra, Earth, Air and

Water and the Animal Game using the wolf Akela, Kaa, Baloo and Bagheera.

Mrs. Owen captured the interest of the group when she read a story from Rudyard Kipling's "Just So Stories".

Mrs. Colter had copies of the day's events to present to each participant, which included a booklet of games, Jungle names, and Jungle opening and closings.

The workshop came to a close with Mrs. Colter and Mr. Peters leading in a Jungle Closing, followed by a prayer led by Mrs. Colter.

District Commissioner John Sharples attended this interesting and fun-filled workshop.
