

Duplicate bridge

Systems: The professional players use the system called Standard American when they go about analysing the hand and how it should play.

You will be able to understand what the Standard American System does to this particular hand when you read the analysis.

There are, however, other systems of bidding out which cause different auctions, and, in some situations, acquire better results.

Examine, if you will the five card major system. This system requires the opener to have five cards in any major suit he starts. This understanding sheds a different light on the north-south hand from the point of view of north for

when he hears south's bid of one heart, he knows immediately that five cards exist in the heart suit in south's hand plus 13 to 15 points.

North now looks at his hand with 10 points and seeing no four-card major would bid 2 clubs. Same as the Standard bidders you say! Yes, but only this far.

South now cannot say two hearts as he would have to hold 8 hearts to do so. Next, to bid spades he or she would need at least four and lots of points (18 plus). Consequently he could conceivably pass knowing that the club suit is at least 7 cards plus the fact that he or she is minimum. South could possibly bid 2NT alerting partner to the fact that the hand holds only 5 hearts, 3

spades and 3 diamonds (if diamonds were four he could bid 2 diamonds).

This leaves 2 cards left for the club suit. Partner now can safely pass for a good board. The Standard system takes a chance in four hearts and the 5 card major system stops early for a better score. This was the hand.

THE ANALYSIS:

North-South may roll in to a poor 4H contract on a sequence such as pass, 1H, pass, 2C, pass, 2H, pass, 3H, pass, 4H. West will probably start the jack of spades (his best lead - he should not lead the K of clubs since he doesn't want a ruff holding 4 trumps) which on the surface looks bad for the defense, but will almost certainly cause declarer to start trumps from the wrong hand.

After covering in dummy and taking east's K, North is likely to lead a trump to the jack. Now defenders take two trump tricks, one club and a spade. If west leads the C-K, South might deduce West has trump length and take the precaution of first finessing diamonds to lead a small heart from dummy. Regardless of how the defense goes, South can later end play east for ten tricks.

Since 4H is likely to go down, N-S will score an above average score if North does not fall victim to the point count system and takes a dim view of his one ace, no kings and square hand.
