Regional hunt

The regional deer hunt got off to a good start, with the weather holding until Tuesday afternoon. Rain does not enhance the deer hunters' chances, but keeps the deer bedded longer. The figures up to deadline (Tuesday afternoon) showed 45 deer harvested in the first two days of the hunt. According to Jim Taylor, a Ministry of Natural Resources representative, this is below what they expected and hoped for. The following two days, however, may see a greater daily harvest and therefore better results of the hunt. Biologist Nancy Tilt told me there were five bucks over the 200 pound weight mark in that first two days, and one of them went 203 pounds "live weight" and had ten points. That is a very large whitetail deer, and was taken close to Milton. There are four checkpoints, Lowville Park, Morrison MTC Station, Peters Corners, and the one at the Town yard on Trafalgar road in Georgetown. One depressing situation, as far as true sportsmen is concerned, is the low number of officers in the field. There are only ten to cover the whole area of the hunt, but there were no problems in the early stages of the four day hunt. Throughout Ontario, there were 13,740 deer hunters that were issued antlerless deer tags. This is out of a total of 34,318 that applied. More news on the hunt as it comes up, with full details in next week's ONTARIO OUTDOORS. For Wednesday there were no reports of deer taken in the Georgetown check station. The total take of the day was not available at The Herald's Friday press deadline.
