### Caught in legion

A 23-year old Aurora man was arrested for break and entry Thursday at 3:08 a.m. when discovered inside the Royal Canadian Legion in Acton. Halton police were responding to an alarm and found the man in possession of money and cigarettes belonging to the Legion. He had entered by forcing the doors. A bail hearing was held Friday afternoon.

### King St. break-in

Kings Variety in Georgetown was broken into last week by thieves who caused \$150 damage to the front door glass of the King Street business. The thieves left empty-handed.

### Homes vandalized

Three Jocelyn Crescent homes in Georgetown were vandalized overnight Friday, Halton regional police said. In one home, \$1,000 damage was caused to a pool liner when a diving board, baby stroller and a water pump were pitched into an in-ground backyard pool. Another home had the pool cover tossed into its pool. A third Jocelyn Crescent home had backyard articles moved around. Its garden shed was entered and a wheelbarrow pulled out onto the lawn and a bicycle pushed into the nearby ravine.

### Tools taken

An unknown quantity of tools and equipment were removed from York Auto Wreckers on the Fourth Line overnight Friday. The business was entered by thieves who climbed tire racks to enter by an open window 12 feet from ground level, Halton regional police said.

### Business robbed

Georgetown Chrysler was broken into Sunday between 3 and 10:30 a.m. The Mountainview Road North business was robbed of \$450 and suffered \$300 worth of damage to a window in its south side door smashed by thieves.

### Jewellery theft

A Raylawn Crescent home in Georgetown had \$400 worth of jewellery stolen last week by thieves who forced a rear door. Halton regional police are investigating.

### Motorist injured

Diane Lawson of Georgetown was treated and released from Georgetown Memorial Hospital Oct. 25 following an accident on Wildwood Road in Georgetown. A driver turning left onto Wildwood Road cut the corner too sharp and was struck by a second vehicle. There was \$2,500 damage.

### Chimney fire

Thursday at 11:05 a.m., fire fighters were called to a Lot 5, Concession 6 chimney fire. There was no damage, deputy fire chief Bob Hyde said.

### Mattress ablaze

There was \$1,500 damage to a McDonald Boulevard home in Acton Thursday at 4:48 p.m. when a juvenile playing with matches started a fire in a bedroom. A mattress, box spring and the bedroom walls and floor were damaged, in the single family residence. Nobody was hurt.

### Terra Cotta accident

A brush fire at the Terra Cotta Conservation Area got out of hand Friday afternoon and firefighters were called out to bring it under control. There was minimal damage as a result. Terra Cotta staff were burning brush as part of the upkeep of the parkland.
