That bright yellow front on the Irwin-Dorsey Ltd. building on Highway 7 near Sinclair Avenue is going to go the way of the dodo bird.

A Limehouse furniture making and distributing company will be bringing about the storefront change Nov. 1 when it moves into the Georgetown premises.

Halsey Originals Inc., which makes and supplies solid oak and pine bedroom furniture, is moving from its Fifth Line location in Limehouse into the larger Irwin-Dorsey building.

"Business is really good. - It couldn't be better," Bonnie Salzsauler said.

The wife of proprietor Roy Salzsauler said people always need new beds and the water bed frames the company produces are becoming more popular because they're a better buy than a regular bed with a mattress. Waterbeds aren't being



bought just because they're "kinky" anymore, Mrs. Salzsauler said.

With the extra space provided by the new location, the company will now be able to have a fireside showroom. It'll be open Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

As well, it will mean the day and night shift employees can work at the same time, doing away with a night shift.

However, Mrs. Saizsauler anticipates a night shift will be started up again in the spring to keep up with the expanding business orders.

Currently employing 26 plant and seven sales employees, Halsey Originals expects to be hiring six more staff in the plant and two for the office.

On Highway 7, the company will be more visible than it was in its previous Limehouse location, and Mrs. Salzsauler said it will be able to attract more passing buyers.

"Out here, it's more word of mouth that causes people to stop in," she said.

Halsey Originals, owned by brothers Roy and

Don Salzsauler, has a store in Oakville and another in Hamilton which they supply - both are called Halsey Solid Wood. The company also sells wholesale to waterbed companies.

Besides waterbed frames, they make dressers, night tables, dressing table hutches, cheval mirrors and armoires, In January they'll be making dining room furniture

again, thanks to the extra space in the Irwin-Dorsey building, Mrs. Salzsauler said.

"But first, that yellow front. It looks pretty bad. We're going to make it look woodsy," she said.

The building became vacant last Dec. 31 when Irwin-Dorsey's parent firm closed the plant in the midst of economic troubles.
