

To help get the calendar off the ground, Ms. Graham is appealing to all area groups to let ber know as soon as possible about the major events they've planned for 1983. She can be contacted at


The calendar atems from her prime objective of helping make the public better informed about the Chamber.

menting specific promotions throughout the year for the downtown BIA will also be part of her duties. Ms. Graham said she's looking forward to working with both BIA and Chamber members.


OPTIMISTS SALUTE YOUTH
