### LEGION HISTORY

Worthy of note is the fact that at the election of officers in March, 1942, that it was passed that a chair covered with a Union Jack and containing a wreath of poppies for the comrade who did not return, would be placed in the front of the room at all future meetings.

The Legion War Fund, headed by Bill Roney thrived, with a great deal of money raised for it. The beverage room was slightly enlarged. Some five members were serving overseas, and many relatives, and sons. A regular program of purchasing Victory bonds and War Savings Certificates was instituted. Poppy Fund grew steadily larger, as did the Christmas tree, with the inclusion of all children under eleven with fathers serving overseas.

Two notable events took

place in 1942 when it was decided to hold the yearly election on a Sunday to allow shiftworkers to be present, and the placing of the Legion Hall at the disposal of the Red Cross, under the presidency of LeRoy Dale, to be used for blood donations. A committee was set up that winter to study reestablishment problems of the veterans as they arrived home, and help solve the employment problem.

Special note could be made of auditors Bill Grant and Hugh Dickie refusing to accept an honorarium offered them in view of their extensive services, but donating it to the war services fund. Fairly substantial sums of money were turned over to the trustees for that distant day when the building would be enlarged to accommodate the expected influx of members after the war's end.
