Area artist Rick Berghammer is sending one of his intricate "leather paintings" to California to bolster a fund-raising drive there for muscular scierosis (MS).


The work, a 24-inch by 30-inch picture of a horse copied from a photograph, will be given to a 16-year old Gilroy, Callfornia, girl whose horse was killed in a tragic accident recently.

Witnesses to the incident launched a campaign to raise funds to replace the animal and the fund-raising efforts were successful that the additional donations earned \$20,000 for MS.

Mr. Berghammer, who works at TDW Sales and Service on Georgetown's Armstrong Avenue, told The Herald that the picture of the girl's new horse, Perfect Glory, took about 240 hours to complete. Work begins on erosion

Work begins on the erosion problem at the Glen Williams cemetery this week following recent approval of a \$107,514 project by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority's executive committee.

Kenaldan Contracting Ltd. of Weston was scheduled to begin installing gabions Monday to protect the riverbanks adjacent to the cemetery. The firm will also fill and regrade an abandoned creek

channel, using mudslide fill from four Glen locations, as part of its \$67,469 contract.

In phase two of the overall project, Inverleigh Construction Ltd. of Milton will build a steel and timber stabilization wall at the top of the bank in the cemetery, protecting several grave sites. That job will cost \$40,045.

Financing the overall project are the province (55 per cent) and Halton Hills (45 per cent).
