RC school contract

Following an all-night negotiation session
Thursday, a tentative contract was agreed upon
between the Halton separate school board's salary
negotiation team and its teachers' negotiation
committee. Particulars of the settlement must be
ratified by the teachers and board trustees, now
being informed of the contract's contents. The
negotiating committee chairman Bill Hawken
anticipates that ratification will be completed by
next week. The new contract will affect the salaries
of 500 teachers. Talks began in the spring. Until
ratification is given, details of the new contract are
not available.
