

Streetsville ousted 6-1 by Bantam Optimists

Streetsville became the twelfth victory for the Georgetown Minor Bantam Optimists Thursday Dec. 2 losing 6-1 in a very fast clean game.

Paul Smith welcomed the visitors early in the first period scoring just 20 seconds into the game on a set up by Sean Finn and Tim Bennett.

In the second period Craig Chantler had the crowd buzzing and the Streetsville goalie talking to himself when he intercepted an errant pass at centre, faked a few attackers out of their equipment, and somehow managed to put the puck up under the crossbar while skating beside the

net. Streetsville's only goal came at the 2:37 mark of this period. Georgetown's Paul Smith deflected Jeff Amato's shot into the net after defenceman Dennis Doucette stopped a breakout play at the Streetsville blueline.

Try as they might, Streetsville just couldn't dent goaltender Joe Balson's armour as he played his strongest game of the season and no doubt the game's first star, if stars of the game were picked.

Mark Moody scored from Terry Dixon and Mark Zebedee to open the scoring the third period. With Streetsville playing

short handed Mark Dunning scored on a low slap shot from the blueline with assists being carried by Rob Cooper and Craig Chantler.

Sean Finn closed out the scoring unassisted when he rifled a wrist-shot to the top corner of the net from the face off circle to the left of the Streetsville net.

Coaches comments: This was perhaps our best game of the season. With only one player missing from the line-up (Bill Herman - broken wrist) everyone else was healthy and came to play hockey. The only injury came after the game - but don't ask "Doc" about

one back with assists to Tim Bennett and Craig Chantler. Mark Moody scored next on a power-play opportunity.

Although not given credit in the play, Dennis Doucette stopped a clearing pass at the blueline, relayed the puck to Dixon who in turn passed to Rory Kennedy then to Zebedee to make the

score 4-1. Georgetown found themselves two men short at the end of the second period and beginning of the third.

Greg Tuck stopped everything thrown at him during this difficult time including a few Milton green shirts.
