# Geminis halt their tailspin

'Best team effort' against Milton produces 6-2 win

In what general manager Bob Webster called the "best team effort all year", the Georgetown Junior B Geminis outkicked and outbattled the Milton Steamers 6-2 Friday night.

The third place Steamers never got untracked because of the Gemini forechecking attack, coach Jules Russiani said.

After a disastrous 7-4 game against the Barrie Colts the night before, the victory was particularly welcomed. The Colts scored six power play goals but in Milton's game the Georgetown club were stingy while penalty killing.

The same held true against the Streetsville Derbys Sunday night at home when Georgetown lost 9-6. The Gems only allowed one power play goal.

### SCORING

Coach Russiani expressed some hint of pleasure over his team's goal scoring output which has also started to improve.

Georgetown looked impressive in their Sunday game against the Derbys, skating with them period for period.

But the overall desire and enthusiasm wasn't showing for the entire Gemini team and Streetsville wanted to win the game more, the coach said.

The team didn't follow their assignments totally and discipline waned, the coach said. As well, the team was missing the defensive work of Peter Haller and the hustle of Paul White, he said.

On a positive note the defence played well, but the refereeing was questionable on several calls which can be crucial in a tight game like Sunday's, Russiani said.

Streetsville coach Larry Stern admitted that "the ref gave us some breaks at times". Stern was impressed at how Georgetown hustled and played smart hockey.

### SKATING

"That Georgetown coach has got them playing well. Georgetown didn't stop skating," Stern said.

Streetsville scored their last goal into an empty net as Georgetown tried to even the score when down two goals in the last minute.

Riv Kennedy had an excellent game for the Gems, scoring two clutch goals, but they were more than matched by the Derbys' Mike Gerrie who scored four goals for his team.

Streetsville have only lost two games this season and have five players in the top eight positions of the Central Junior B scoring leadership.

In the first period the Geminis held their own against Streetsville for

the first six minutes when goaltender Mike Steer was beaten in a crowd in front of the net.

### POWER PLAY

Gemini forward Mark Hamilton walked away from a potential fight which gave his team a power play opportunity. Affiliate player Steve Marcolini scored a goal on the power play on a rebound to tie the game at 1-1.

The Derbys went ahead on a goal shot from just inside the blue line that bounced off Steer's pad and trickled in.

From the slot, defenceman Chris Peavoy tied the game for Georgetown with 34 seconds left in a power play attempt.

In the second period the Derbys scored early on a goal mouth scramble.

With each team short one man, Herb Kewley scored a goal for Georgetown when he poked one behind Streetsville's Les Williams from behind the net.

A questionable call by the referee resulted in Streetsville taking a 5-4 lead on a goal scored after the puck was smothered by four Gemini players in the slot area for about 10 seconds.

The puck finally came loose and Mike Gerrie for the Derbys was Johnny on the spot to flip in an empty net goal.

### SLIDER

An obviously upset Mike Steer was beat

Streetsville went ahead 6-4 on a deke that fooled Mike Steer who stopped to the ice. Streetsville added another on a wrist shot from the left face-off circle.

Jay Barwell for the Geminis put some spirit

back on the team with his goal on a shot from the slot which he neatly maneuvered into from the blue line.

The emotion-packed second period ended with one major fight which saw Chris Peavoy ejected from the game for the Geminis.

In the third period Riv Kennedy put Georgetown within one goal of Streetsville with his shot off a rebound. With 7:40 left in the game the Geminis seemed to be threatened,

but the Derbys came back and scored one minute later.

### EMPTY

The last goal was an empty net by Streetsville after the Gems took Steer out in favor of an extra attacker.

Mike Steer stopped three clear breakaways in the third period and looked good, but coach Russiani felt he let in about three soft goals during the course of the game.

During Milton's con-

test, the Geminis went ahead 3-1 in the first period on goals by Mike Doucette, Kevin Frank and Bob Davey.

Georgetown kept Milton off the scoreboard in the second period while scoring on a power play by Mark Hamilton and adding another by Kevin Frank on a shorthanded effort.

Brad McMeekin put one by the Steamers' Rick Landry to end the score at 6-2.

### Chrysler Raiders dominate Flyers

The Raiders in Barrie Friday night trounced their opponents 18-2, then came back to Georgetown and registered a 10-4 win.

In an awesome display of offence, Georgetown only led 3-2 after the first period Friday night, but they exploded for six goals in the second period and nine goals in the final period.
