Bridge overhaul

The Canadian National bridge spanning railway tracks below Regional Road 43 in Limehouse is due for a major structural overhaul next year; in the meantime, CN has agreed with the region that load limitations for the structure should be reduced. The steel frame-timber deck bridge has been handling loads of up to ten tonnes (eleven tons) but the new limitations, recommended by the region's planning and public works committee last Wednesday, have decreased that to five tonnes (5.5 tons). Funded entirely by CN, work on the bridge is expected to begin in the spring, replacing some of the steel structures and rebuilding the wooden deck. An asphalt surface is also proposed in the project.
