Now seek UN nuke vote after referendum success

Heraid Special This Christmas, "Peace on Earth" may be spoken with a little more

fervor in Halton Hills. With results now in from almost all Canadian municipalities which conducted referenda on disarmament this year, it appears that the "Yes" votes definitely have it!

About five million Canadians in 140 cities and towns voted for balanced, verifiable global disarmament, with the average for the "Yes" vote being 75 per cent. Halton Hills' vote was a little lower at 71.2 per cent. Oakville lower still

with 67.5 per cent, and Toronto a resounding 78.8 per cent.

Hamilton recorded 72 per cent, Kitchener 64 (about the lowest anywhere), and Waterloo 77. Even higher percentages were recorded in Stratford (82), Thunder Bay (81), and a number of rural Quebec townships

From Vancouver to Chester Nova Scotia (77 per cent) the results were highly encouraging for supporters of Operation Dismantle, the Ottaws group which initiated the referendum idea, and which will now press for a

world vote on disarmament, at the UN.

Jim Stark, who began working towards this objective five years ago as founder of Operation Dismantie, expected no more than a 65 to 70 per cent yes vote.

"We're looking at nearly 80", he said recently. "This will be our ammunition in the fight for a UN ballot. It will strengthen the resolve of the MPs already committed to seeing this through." Mr. Stark said his per-

sonal resolve has been flagging. "I'm tired, I'm broke", he said on the Ontario election night. "But I'm going to give it one more good year. This s a great experience. "The military were






