off garbage, an increase of 500 cars a month since 1980. The station is open three days a week.

To accommodate the large volume of garbage anticipated if the firm handles all the waste collected in town, Leferink plans to buy a large compactor. Because of the urgent need to find something to do with the town's garbage before the full-service station is approved, the town has asked the environment ministry to waive the public hearing requirement under the Environmental Protection Act.

Under the agreement proposed between the town and Leferink, the expanded site would be open to town garbage truck traffic between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The agreement, which must be endorsed by the ministry, would come into effect Jan. 3 and expires June 30.

If the agreement is terminated early, Leferink is entitled to monthly compensation until the June 30 expiry date.


