The prime purpose of an engine oil is to lubricate. Motor oil prevents such moving parts as cylinder walls, piston rings, bearings, crankshafts, camshafts, valves, valve guides and followers from rubbing together.

Oil helps stop engine corrosion and rusting from condensation or from the acids formed in the combustion chamber. Lubricants keep the engine clean by preventing contaminants from depositing on engine parts. Oil also helps cool the engine.


