## They back Clark

The national Conservative party convention will be held in Winnipeg Jan. 26 to 30 and a number of local Tories will be attending as delegates or alternate-delegates. The Herald asked some of them a question they'll vote on at one point during the convention: Whether the Tories should hold a leadership review in the near future.



FRAN BAINES: "Definitely not; I'm very, very opposed to it. Frankly, I don't think there should be a leadership review every two years. Mr. Clark has an excellent record over the last year or two. He was very effective in the constitutional debate and the 'ringing of the bells'. We should go to Winnipeg and come back a unified party and win some elections like we did in Temiskaming (recent by-election in northern Ontario)."



GRAEME GOEBELLE "Definitely not. People who are for a leadership review have their own aspirations - they're all the kind of people (Tory leader) Joe Clark didn't accept in the first place. Joe's done a tremendous Job in opposition - he's probably been the best opposition leader of all time. I think he deserves another chance at runnng the show."



OTTO JELINEK, Halton MP: "The question is not whether anyone is for Mr. Clark or against Mr. Clark; I think that Mr. Clark is far better than Pierre Trudcau, for example. As prime minister I think he'll be far better than Mr. Trudeau. The issue is will the leadership convention clear the air within the Conservative party and my feeling is that it will."



Brampton - Georgetown MP: "No, I'm against review. By all means, Mr. Clark should take over from Mr. Trudeau, but not when Mr. Trudeau steps down, but when we defeat him at the polls. I don't think (Trudeau) is going to retire."
