ed by Graham Shepherd and Pries' second goal with Hammer assisting.

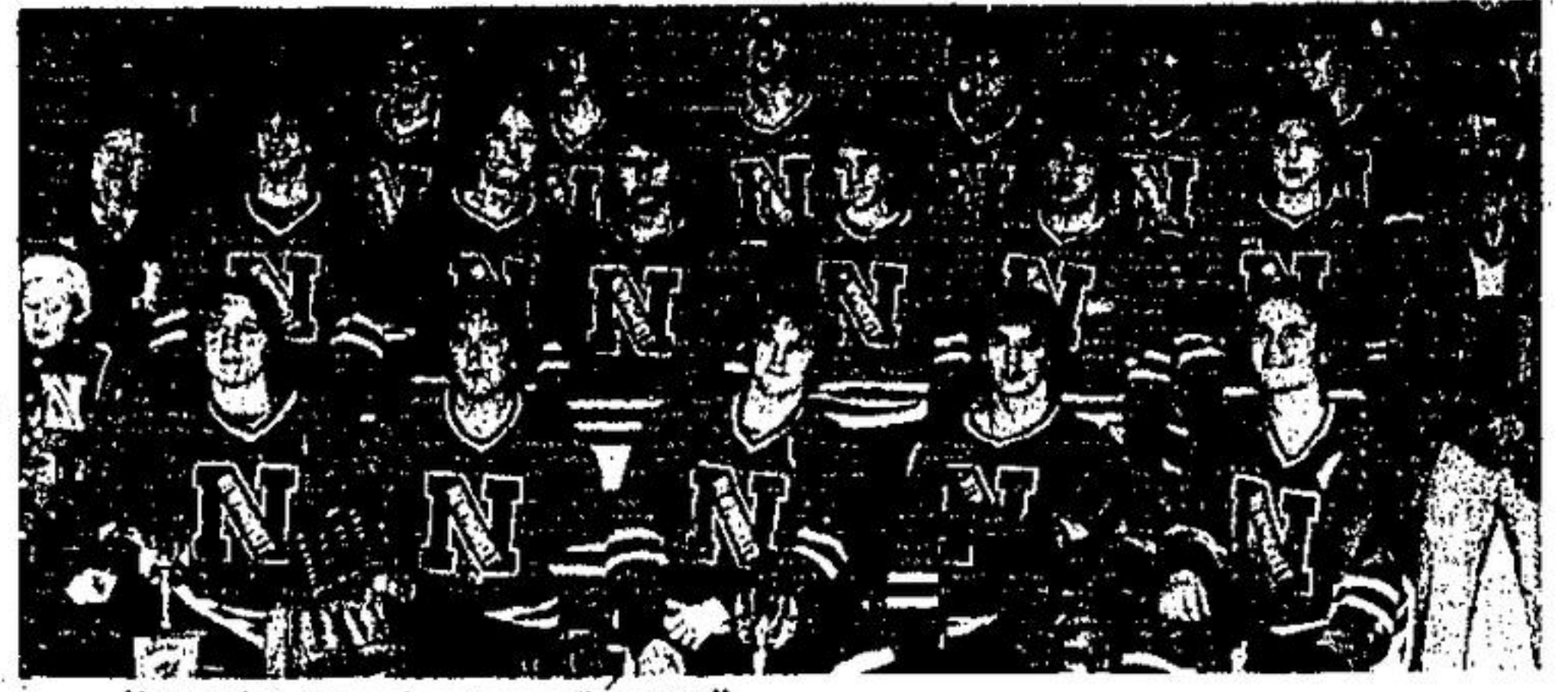
