Firm experiments

While the future of Abitibi-Price's Georgetown operation remains in doubt, the company is exploring new ways to keep the local plant in business.

Layoffs have continued at the plant, manager George Lockwood told The Herald Monday. He didn't rule out the possibllity of more in the future as the firm struggles to remain viable in the paper-coating market. (Wallpaper is an example of Abitibl Georgetown's product line).

"There were some employees laid off about two or three weeks ago," Mr.


Lockwood said. "We've got different things in the works right now. I could tell you one thing and the next week it could be something different. .

"We have different trials we're looking at and if they work out we may keep more employees,"

While the plant regularly employs about 125 people, the recession has brought that figure down to about 70 or 80.

Although he declined to specify what kind of "trials" the plant was considering, Mr. Lockwood said Ablibi was looking at new products for the plant's operation.

Periodic layoffs and rehirings have taken place at the 77-year old plant since July, 1981, when Abitibi officials, union reps and managers forecast that the plant's closure was "inevitable".
