

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## Get to know duplicate bridge

At one time in the past, it has been said that if the partnership at a bridge table has 26 points between them, this pair should be able to make four of a suit or 3NT. Similarity 32 points should ensure a small slam and 37, a big or grand slam.

There are, however, hands that occur whereby pairs may make these above mentioned contracts even though the point count does not indicate it. Such a hand is today's.

Note that East-West hold an abundance of twenty-five points between them and it is possible to make a slam. The reason for this phenomenon is the shortness in suits. Note that East is short in hearts and West is short in clubs.

Further fortune falls to the East-West pair when both the spade king and the diamond king is found pinned against the corresponding aces in the East hand. Of course the difficulty is in bidding and

THE ANALYSIS: Some East-West pairs may reach a not totally unreasonable 6 spade

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contract, but this will occur only where East opens 1 diamond and raises spades on the secand round. West cannot help but visualize the perfect fit and will probably Blackwood his way to slam. Although this sequence won't be found very often, all declarers in a spade contract should

take twelve tricks. Assume North finds the best lead of a trump (no lead hurts), declarer wins in dummy, noting South's drop of the ten, comes to his hand with the club ace and lays down the diamond queen. When this holds. West cashes the heart ace, ruffs a heart in dummy, trumps a club and ruffs another heat on board with the spade ace.

After cashing the diamond ace and trumping a club, West's remaining cards are the 965 of spades and the heart king. The spade 9 loses to North's king but North must put declarer back in his hand to draw the outstanding trump. Note the key features of the

play: the early diamond finesse to maintaincommunications and cashing the diamond ace so that North will have to put declarer back into his hand to draw the remaining trump.

The club meets every Tuesday night at the Georgetown Legion Hall on Mill Street. Game time is 7:45 p.m. Come and play bridge!

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
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
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
