The mice are the main instigators of a plot to save the romance and as other toys join in, there's an impressive explosion of dancing variations from a number of ethnic backgrounds.

The performances, youngsters playing youngsters, older dancers playing adults and still others adopting the complicated personae to toy dolls and animals was fresh and exciting.

With one other successful John Elliott Theatre performance-"Alice in Wonderland" last year-, one hopes that the Elizabeth Paterson dancers will be stopping in Georgeiown on a regular


