Eight new members joined the Credit Valley Conservation Authority at the 215th inaugural meeting Jan. 21.

The election of the 1983 officers was held with two new members elected to the seven member executive committee.

Howard Stewart was appointed authority chairman by the province, making this his third year in the position. Ken Williams, the mayor of Brampton, was returned as the authority's vice-chairman.

William Hunter of Caledon replaces Robert Harrison as the executive committee's member-at-large. The other new committee member is chairman of the conservation services advisory board, Dick Martin. Mr. Martin, a provincial appointee, replaces Harold Darraugh of Orangeville who retired from the Credit Valley Conservation Authority

after eight years as conservation services chairman.

The remainder of the executive is comprised of the chairmen of the other three advisory boards: Harold Kennedy of Mississauga, Clark Glassford of Caledon and James Dods of Orange-

ville.

In 1982 the general membership approved a reorganization of the Authority's advisory board. Each member who is not on the executive now sits on two advisory boards. This will allow each member greater

participation in Authority decision-making.
