

Duplicate bridge advice

Today's hand, played by the Georgetown Duplicate Bridge Club, is the duplicate players "swing" hand. A swing hand is a deal whereby both pairs at the table may make a game; North-South in Hearts and East-West in spades. The "swing" is in the score.

If North-South are allowed to play 4 Hearts, they earn 620 points. Should East-West play in 4 spades, they would earn 420. This is a difference of 200 points. Most hands will vary by a few points to a few hundred. This one varies by 1000 points. Consequently, it is termed "a swing".

Both hands are not considered the proverbial "lay-down" hands as in each case a particular lead will destroy either contract. Can you find the lead?

THE HAND:

THE ANALYSIS:

This board should be entitled "The Saga of the Opening Lead". If North is declarer at 4 hearts (opening 4 hearts or jumping to 4 hearts over West's 1 club opening is practically the only way to get there), East must

specifically lead a club to defeat the hand. Otherwise declarer takes a trump finesse and uses dummy's trump entries to establish the diamond suit. East is not a favorite to find this lead if West does not open his ace-less hand. Even more difficult

though, is South's opening lead problem should East-West get to 4 spades, which they might as a sacrifice. The save could easily turn into a make unless South is clairvoyant enough to lead a diamond. Against any other lead, declarer merely needs to pick up North's king doubleton of trumps for ten tricks. This is a real swing hand for the final result depends not only on the bidding, but on the play and defense. Practically any plus score will be worth 9 out of 12.

The North-South winners at the Georgetown Bridge Club were Eileen Craig and Roy Turton followed closely by Ron Glide and Jackie Forsell in second place. Third spot went to Peter Gostovic and Brian Ayer.

The second place (East-West) was won by Grant

Real and Jack Krane while Ron and Jean Jones were second and Fred Allen and Judy Rivers won third spot.
