Heritage dinner sold out

It's official. The Hockey Heritage banquet, set for Monday, Mar. 7 at the Gordon Alcott Hall, is sold out.

Heritage committee chairman Dave Kentner announced Monday that all tickets, which were going at \$15 per adult and \$10 per child had been distributed.

"I've got eight tickets left, in my pocket right now, and I'm still getting calls," Kentner enthused. "After today, there just aren't any more tickets available."

The committee president said the sell-out, the earliest ever, indicates the Heritage event is

growing in popularity.

Kentner also announced Monday that Bill McKeown of Georgetown Chrysler, an ex-professional entertainer, will share the master of ceremonies duties with Trevor Moores, the man who has chaired the evening for the past five years.

Also, 13 of the 17 members of this year's "Feature Team", the 1950 Georgetown Raiders, have confirmed they will attend this year's banquet. Each attending team member will receive a commemorative pin and team photo as part of the festivities.

Nomination deadline for awards just three weeks away

Only a handful of people have been nominated for the 1983 Recognition and Honor Awards, with less than three weeks remaining until the cut-off date for submissions.

Recreation department superintendent of programs, Joy Gwilliam said she has received just five nominations so far, with the deadline date of Friday, Mar. 11 fast approaching. The 10-member Recognition and Honor Awards Night committee is scheduled to meet one week later to decide on the final winners, who will receive their awards April 7 at the

Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre.

"It always starts slow like this," Gwilliam said recently, noting that more than 100 people received awards last year. "The people always seem to come out of the woodwork the last week, but we'd like to get them out a little sooner."

To qualify for an award, a group or individual must have brought recognition and honor to Georgetown during the past year. Last year's winners included the Georgetown District High School swimming Rebels, and the Centennial School boys wrestling team.

The awards are not just limited to sports teams and individuals, however. Anyone who has made a significant cultural contribution to the town's reputation may be eligible for a recognition award. Gwilliam says that nominators are usually someone close to the achiever.

"It's usually a coach

who has seen his kids working hard, or a parent or good friend that is aware of the person's efforts and achievements," she said.

Nomination forms are currently available in the public schools, or at the municipal offices. They are also available at the Acton municipal offices on Mill Street.

The awards evening

will get underway at 7 p.m., in the John Elliott Theatre at the Cultural Centre. A press session, including a display of trophies and medals won by various award winners will begin a half hour earlier.

The 287 seats in the theatre are available by invitation only. The festivities are not open to the general public.
