He centres the Gems' top line, between Bill Bathgale and Herb Kewley, and he admits the chance to play with his brothers was one of the major factors in his decision to suit up in the green and gold this year.

"I wouldn't have played if they weren't on the team," Lance admits straightforwardly. Brother Mike, self-appointed "Spokesman" for the trio, sees things differently. "Dave and I carry the big guy," he deadpans. "We carried him when we played tyke, too."

Mike, the middle Doucette at 18, is a direct contrast to brother Lance. While big brother is quiet and easy going, Mike is gregarious, almost to the point of being cocksure. Asked about his role on the team, Mike tosses out "enforcer, goal-scorer, a real playoff man."

He laughs, while big brother Lance scoffs and looks at the ceiling. Little brother Dave just shakes his head. Asked about his feelings about his brothers, Mike is more serious.

"We don't go drinking together, say, so we're not close in that respect," he explains. "But if a player on another team has a problem with one of us, then there are three of us to straighten it out for him." The youngest of the three, Dave, is the most shy. His personality complements his playing style, in that he's efficient and confident, but off the ice he's overshadowed by his brothers. When the young blueliner tries to tell an interviewer that he feels his joining the club after Christmas was important to the team's dramatic playoff turn-around, brother Mike interjects. "We got better because

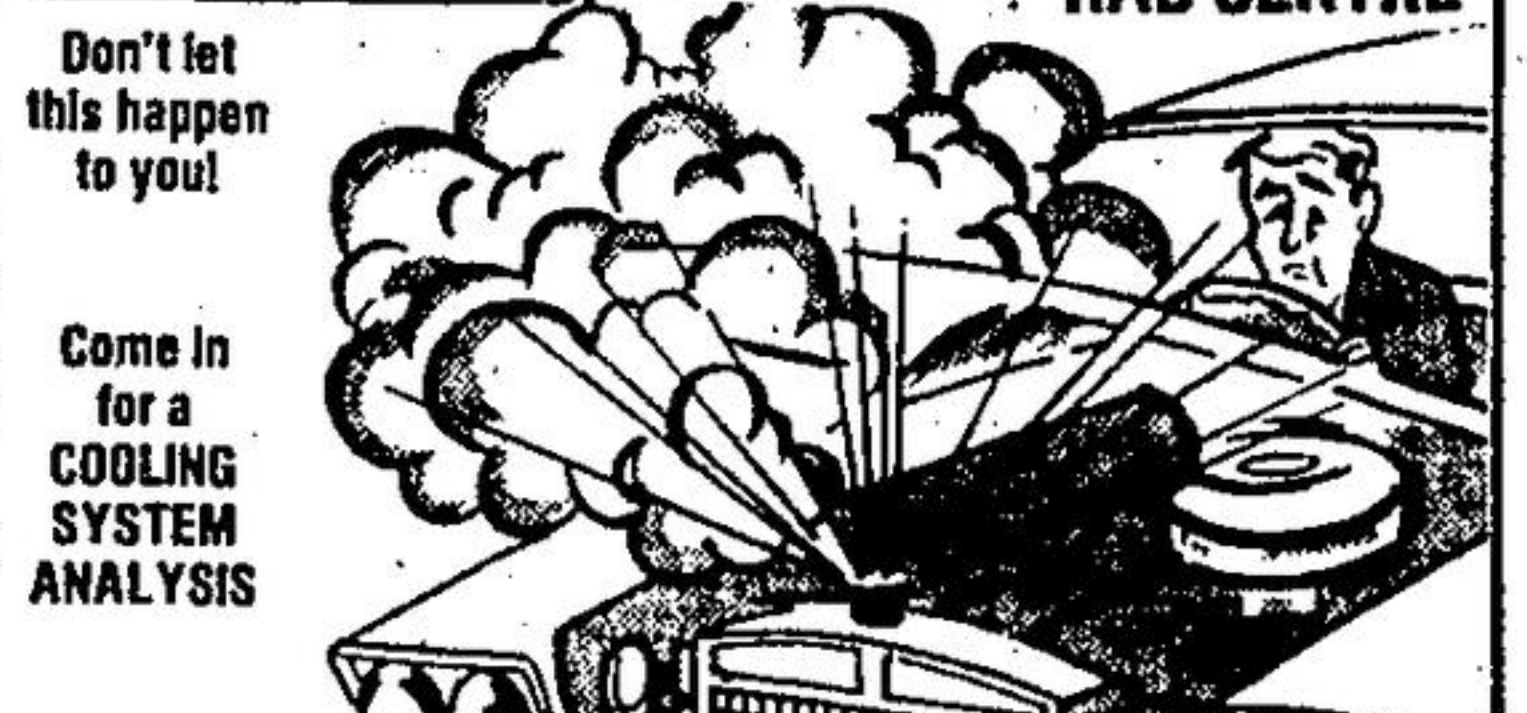
