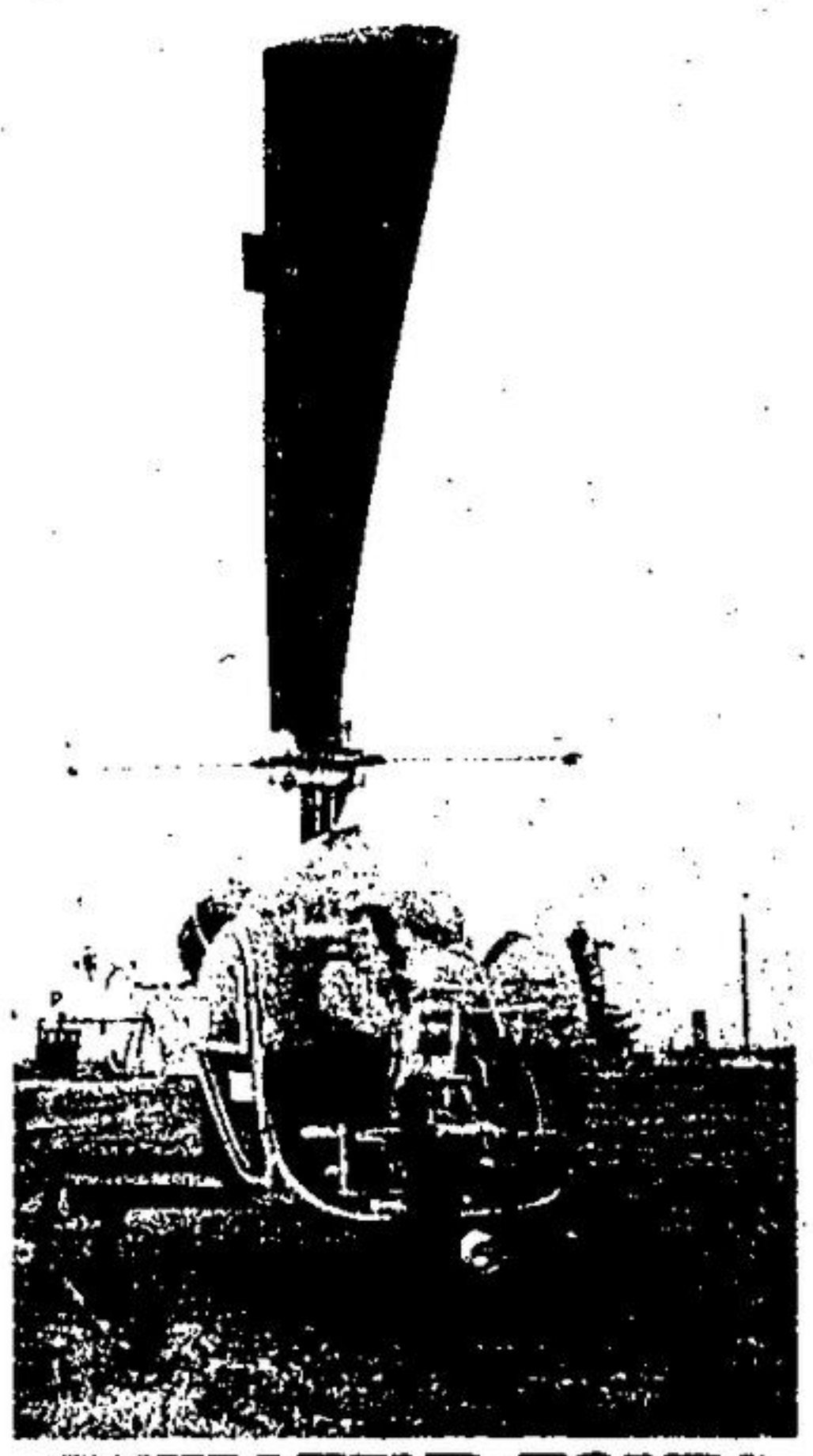
Stewarttown Senior School invites parents to their open house all day Tuesday April 26 and Thursday April 28.

Feel the spirit with choral society

The Georgetown Choral Society, once again, invites residents to join them in their spring concert. There are few better ways of sharing the optimism of spring, with its promise for the coming year, than in song and joy.

The program has been carefully selected for all tastes with solos, chorales all spiced with four to eight part harmonies.

"All tastes, you say, how do you plan to do that?"

First, let's respond with an axiom that any choir led by A. Dale Wood must take on the complexion of its director. That would assure versatility, imagination and a performance standard several levels higher than any of the choir members could dream of.

This year, for instance, the choir's Messiah performance was cut on a commercial tape, on sale at the door; again, there were a couple of video performances of last fall's concerts.

Secondly, a test of content should be in

order. "Feel the Spirit", will have a substantial range, not listed in any concert order. Starting at the beginning, Dale will conduct a couple of happy nursery rhymes set in harmony, for the kids.

Our rural setting prompts a touch of country with two poems of Robert Frost set to music, The Road Not Taken being one. The sense of contemplation is built on with prayers in song including The Lord's Prayer and Bless This House. The tempo then picks up to songs of praise with R. Vaughan Williams' Five Mystical Songs and the glorious, two

choir, echo setting of Psalm 100, among others. Praise is merged into the counterpoint of rhythm as the spirituals add their lustre and gentle sadness to the evening with, Set Down Servant and Nobody Knows the Trouble, to mention two. Finally, the variety of song is capped with a celebration of life in the last chorale from Bach's Mass in B Minor. If the clapping warrants, Dale might be persuaded to add the Hallelujah Chorus as an encore.

Did we cover everyone? Why not come to "Feel the Spirit" and decide for yourself. It will play on May 14 and 15 at the John Elliott Theatre, Georgetown.

Advance tickets will cost \$5 for adults and \$3 for students and seniors. Tickets at the door, if available, will cost \$1 more. Tickets may be picked up or reserved by calling 877-6839 (p.m.) or at the Theatre Box Office from April 6 to May 12, on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 7:30 - 9:00 p.m.

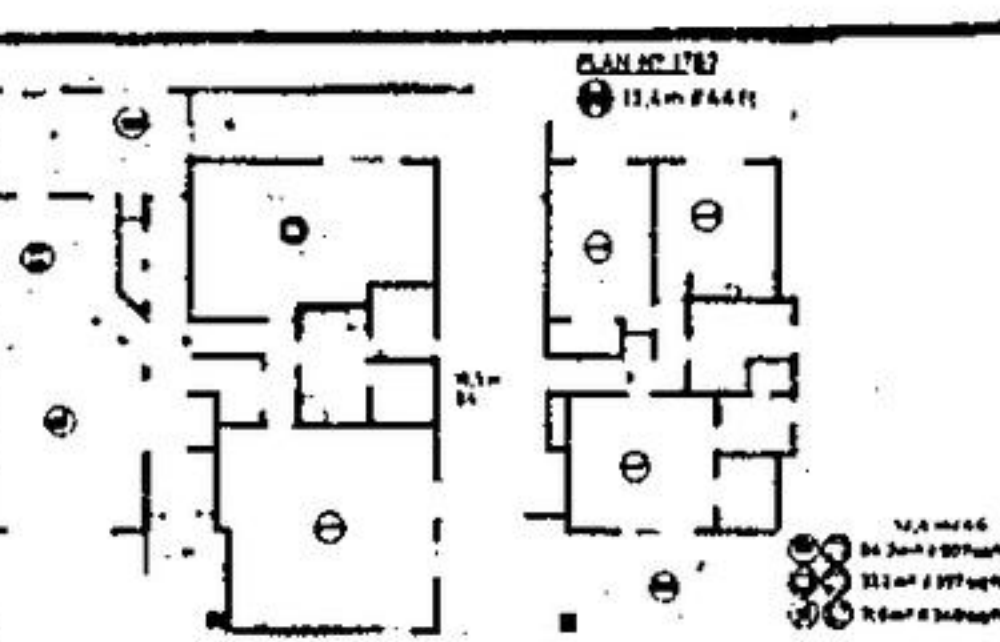

This split-level home design is perfectly suited to the medium frontage residential building lot and provides almost 2,000 square feet of well-organized finished floor space on its two levels. The well thought-out floor plan provides a wide range of amenities certain to please the medium-size family which desires style and convenience at every turn. The wide, handsome exterior may be finished in a variety of siding alternatives, and with either a shake roof or more conventional shingles.

The side oriented main entry leads into a compact reception foyer and outerwear storage area, from which traffic moves naturally to the left and down two floors into the sunken living room. The living room features a sloping beamed ceiling, full-width windows and a recessed masonry fireplace for convivial "at-homes". The elevated formal dining room separates from the living room by means of an optional spindle screen wall, and from the kitchen-diner via space-saving pocket door.
