Open house on Saturday

The Ministry of Natural Resources has extended the dates for obtaining a small game licence in Ontario. The current licence will be in effect until the fall when they will be issued again. This means that there will be one licence per year, as I predicted a few weeks ago. There will be no more "ground hog" permits, and the changes in season will be inconsequential. Small game and wildfowl seasons will open simultaneously in many parts of Ontario. Complete details are available from the local Ministry office or by calling or writing me at 877-8250, 25 Carole Street, Georgetown, L7G 3K3.

I will have the list of areas and seasons with me at my OPEN HOUSE at the CANADIAN TIRE STORE, this Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Information on this show can be found in Canadian Tire ad in this paper.

There has been some great trout fishing in the Collingwood and Owen Sound areas, where the season is open all year. With this in mind, and the regular season opening here April 30, the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters big fish contest is under way. Prizes will be awarded for largest fish in several categories, and an entry meeting the minimum requirements will be eligible to win a personalized silver 25th anniversary plaque. A TROUT FESTIVAL will be held at Kortright Centre this weekend.

There will be information about fish management and various other programs such as "Save Our Streams". Films will be shown and there will be a guided hike to a stream reclamation project. Learn to tie flies on Sunday, with demonstrations on fishing and fish handling.

Try the conservation areas on opening day. Glen Haffey on Airport Road below Hwy. 9 is always excellent, and crowded. Heart Lake in Brampton is stocked with trout and is close to home. Terra Cotta should be stocked with trout, but last year the fish came in the middle of May. I do not have the date of delivery but I should have it by Saturday.

Local streams have been in top class shape, but may change drastically in the next two weeks. If rain and stormy weather don't change the volume in the streams, there should be fishing in about the same places as last year. A heavy storm could change the bottom structure of small and large waters and change the location of feed lanes of fish. Holding areas also change at this time.

Drop by at CANADIAN Tire this Saturday (April 23) and try winning one of the prizes. No cost or obligation, just drop by to talk fishing and fill in a draw ticket. Bring your questions, bring your family, and drop in.

BMX racing

Bang-o-rama

Attention future motocross stars! Pedal-bike racing, more popularly known as BMX racing, is coming to Georgetown.

The Georgetown Optimist Club will be sponsoring "Bang-o-rama", a day full of bike racing at the Fairgrounds, May 23.

The first 200 boys and girls to send in their entry forms can compete, beginning at 10 a.m. There will be heats and finals, which should get underway around 4 p.m. Prizes and ribbons are up for grabs.

Optimist Mike Remes is organizing the races, and he says they will become an annual event if all goes well this year. Remes came up with the idea from watching the kids in his neighborhood.

"I saw how the kids around my place set up ramps and do jumps, how they're just crazy about it," Remes said. "The kids want to show off their bike-riding skills. The interest is there."

Remes said that there may also be a skills competition for the riders, including jumping for distance and height, wheel stands and donuts, and other trick riding events.

The races will be open to kids between the ages of 8-14. They will be divided into four divisions, competing against others close to their own ages.

Entry forms can be

The forms must be signed by the entrant's parents and mailed to "Optimist BMX Races, Box 175, Georgetown." Applications must also include a stamped, self-addressed envelope.
